ORDER ON PARTIES' JOINT MOTION
TO FIND COMPLIANCE WITH
ENFORCEABLE OUTCOMES AND
DISMISS
(Proposed)

11 This matter came before the Court upon the parties' joint Motion to Find Compliance
12 with Enforceable Outcomes and Dismiss. In this motion, the parties agree that the Department
13 is in compliance with all three of the last three remaining enforceable outcomes in this matter,
14 which were ordered by the Court on January 31, 2019. This Court had previously found that the
15 other previously enforceable outcomes in the 2011 Revised Settlement and Exit Agreement were
16 no longer enforceable because this court previously found the Department had achieved full
17 compliance with them, or by operation of the parties' agreement the outcomes were no longer
18 enforceable. Thus, the parties agreed that the there was no further basis for judicial enforcement,
19 judicial enforcement should end, and the matter be dismissed.

20 Having reviewed the joint motion, and fully considered all of the pleadings, the Court
21 makes the following:

22 **FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

- 23 1. The Department has achieved 18 months of full compliance with Missing from Care
24 Outcomes 1, 2, and 3.


- 1 2. The Department has therefore achieved Missing from Care Outcomes 1, 2, and 3, and
2 they are therefore no longer enforceable.
3 3. All remaining enforceable outcomes have been fully achieved.

5 Now, therefore, based on the foregoing, the Court hereby

6 **ORDERS THAT:**

- 7 1. The Parties' Joint Motion to Find Compliance with Enforceable Outcomes is granted.
8 2. From the date of this Order, Missing from Care Outcomes 1, 2, and 3 are no longer
9 subject to judicial enforcement.
10 3. All enforcement, compliance, reporting, fee payment, and any other requirements
11 arising from the Revised Settlement Agreement, as enforced by order of this court on
12 November 7, 2014, and as modified by subsequent court orders, are no longer in
13 effect.
14 4. This court's jurisdiction and oversight in this matter is concluded.
15 5. This matter is dismissed.




