KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

If ICE comes to your home...

- Do not open your door unless an ICE agent shows you a warrant (either pressed against a window or slid under the door).
- *** A warrant of removal/deportation (Form I-205) does not allow officers to enter without consent.
- You have the right to remain silent, even if the officer has a warrant.
- You have the right to speak to a lawyer.

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

If ICE or Border Patrol stops you in a car...

- You have the right to remain silent - always.
 - You can refuse to consent to a search of the car.
- ***Officers must have reasonable suspicion that you have violated an immigration or federal law.

If ICE or Border Patrol stops you on a bus or train...

- You have the right to remain silent - always.
- ***Officers will likely ask passengers brief questions about their identity and immigration status.
